

The Office of the Chief Scientific Adviser was established in 2004 to provide the Government with independent, expert advice on issues related to public science policy. Prof. Patrick Cunningham was appointed for a five year term from January, 2007.

The main responsibilities of the Chief Scientific Adviser (CSA) are to:

- Provide high-level advice on scientific issues of concern to Government across the spectrum of disciplines;
- Provide scientific input to the development and review of the Government's Strategy for Science, Technology and Innovation (SSTI 2006-2013).

The CSA reports to the Cabinet Committee on Science, Technology and Innovation.
